For an Attended or Unattended burial funeral, the burial fee 1	£726-£740
In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee is: For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial in place, you will also need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.	£740
